Listecki this week issued a <u>statement</u> on behalf of all Wisconsin bishops reiterating Catholic teaching on the rights of workers, the role of unions, and the necessity for all interested parties to work together for the common good in this current fiscal crisis.

# U.S. Bishops Laud House Committee Vote on Protect Life Act

This week, the Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) hailed the approval in committee of the Protect Life Act (H.R. 358). As reported in the last Capitol Update, the Act would apply longstanding federal policies on abortion funding, and conscience rights on abortion, to the new health care reform or Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA). The bill is now available for consideration by the entire House.

# U.S. Bishops and Catholic Relief Services Urge Congress to Put Poor First

In two letters to Congress this week, U.S. bishops and Catholic Relief Services reminded members of Congress that setting budget priorities involves moral choices and urged them not to make deep cuts in poverty-focused international assistance.
